Daisy Delyght Ritz, 85, of Chanute passed away on Monday, January 31, 2022. Daisy was born on November 13, 1936 in Miller, Missouri, the daughter of Orville Hanson and Minnie Dell (Williams) Rayborn.

Daisy grew up in Chanute and graduated from Chanute High School in 1955. After graduating from high school Daisy met the love of her life, Charles Ritz at the Church of God in Chanute and they were married on January 22, 1956 in the Church of God Parsonage in Chanute. Daisy and Charles soon started a family, and Daisy enjoyed milking cows with her twin boys. 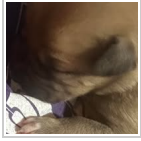
