Glenn Wayne Wrestler, 89 of Chanute, passed away Friday, November 15 at Neosho Memorial Hospital. Glenn was born December 17th, 1934 in rural Chanute to Claude Oral and Juanita Lois (Brinkmeyer) Wrestler.
