January 9, 1917 - September 18, 2008

Jessie Mae McNeë, age 91, of Moline, Kansas passed away Thursday, September 18, 2008 at the Sedan City Hospital in Sedan, Kansas. Jessië was born on January 9, 1917 in Dalhart, Texas the daughter of William and Lillie Belle (McCurdy) Walker.
