Julie Ann McIlvaine, 61, passed away peacefully on Tuesday January 23, 2018 at her home in Eureka, KS.

Julie was born January 17, 1957 to Carolyn (Scofield) and Leland Huxford. They resided in Wichita KS where Julie attended and graduated from Heights High School. Upon graduation she was the manager of Riverside Mobile Home Park for several years.
