Mary E. (Webster) Barnes, age 96, a lifelong resident of Howard, Kansas passed away Monday, November 15, 2010 at the Greenwood County Hospital in Eureka, Kansas. She was born on October 27, 1914 the daughter of Walter C. and Maude (Biddinger) Webster.

Mary was a graduate of Howard High School. On March 2, 1933, Mary was united in marriage to Ray J. Stark and to this union was born one daughter Donna Marlene Stark.
