Roma was the last survivor of the Turner family and was well loved. She made a lasting impression to all she encountered. At the age of 3 her family moved to Chanute, KS where she later graduated high school. Roma later attended Pittsburg State University where she received honors & distinction & a Bachelors Degree in music. She then became a Doctor of Chiropractic Medicine graduating from the Cleveland Chiropractic College in Kansas City, MO.

Roma had a successful chiropractic business in, Kansas City, Branson, & Springfield, MO for many years. She was also an ordained minister, Reiki Master, Certified Bio Energetic Synergistic Technician, nutrition consultant, acupressure and acupuncturist.

She taught herself to play the piano in the 1990's and enjoyed playing any

musical instrument she could get her hands on. Roma was a gadget guru and avid QVC shopper. She loved preparing for any possible future disasters of any kind like if the electricity went out, tornado hit or anything else.
