On July 24, 2021, Suzanne Sievers went home to be with her heavenly Father at St. Luke's East Hospital in Lee's Summit, MO due to severe complications from being diagnosed with COVID-19. Suzanne was born January 29, 1965 in Nashville, TN and was 56 years old at the time of her passing.

Suzanne grew up in Hixson, TN, where she then went on to meet her husband Richard Sievers in Fallon, NV. They lived in Chattanooga, TN for a while before eventually settling down in Yates Center, KS.
