Thomas Lynn Cloke, 74, passed away on Sunday, January 5, 2025, at Neosho Memorial Regional Medical Center in Chanute, Kansas. He was born on March 25, 1950, in Leavenworth, Kansas, to Richard V. Cloke and O. Helen (Gardner) Cloke.

Born into an Air Force family, Tom experienced a life of travel and adventure during his early years. He graduated from Chanute High School in 1968 and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in psychology from Pittsburg State University. In 1969, he joined the United States Army and served honorably until his discharge in 1970.

Tom dedicated his professional life to helping others as a vocational counselor for the ANW Special Education Cooperative. His commitment to service extended beyond his career; he was a lifelong member of the First United Methodist Church and the Masonic Lodge. He was also a proud member of the Tau Kappa Epsilon fraternity.

Tom had a wide array of interests that reflected his zest for life. He enjoyed golf, meteorology, aviation, skydiving, and cheering on KU basketball. An avid animal lover, he found joy in the companionship of animals throughout his life. Above all, Thomas was devoted to his family, especially his grandchildren, who affectionately knew him as "Tippy."
