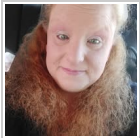

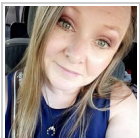
“ Aww my buddy Vic. You are a great person & going to be missed. Wished I could of seen ya again. My thoughts and prayers for your family. Miss ya my friend
